The Common Country Analysis (CCA) is the UN system's independent and comprehensive assessment and analysis that examines progress, gaps, opportunities, and bottlenecks to Belize's commitment to achieving the 2030 Agenda. This analysis will underpin the strategic priorities of the new Cooperation Framework for the Caribbean, including Belize, under the UN Multi-Country Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNMSDCF) 2022–2026.

The UNMSDCF is the most important instrument for planning and implementing UN development activities at the country level in support of the 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development.

The preparations of the CCA are led by UN agencies, funds, and programmes as an integrated, forward-looking, and evidence-based joint analysis of the context for sustainable development in Belize.

The UN Resident Coordinator Office would like to take this opportunity to present the findings of the CCA, as well as receive the important views of your organization and the constituents you serve; as meaningful, inclusive, and diverse engagement is a central tenant to foster enhanced partnerships for the 2030 Agenda.
